

## Work at Height Sign Post Course

- be able to identify solutions, plan for these solutions and manage the solutions when on site.
- know where to locate further guidance.

### Facilities

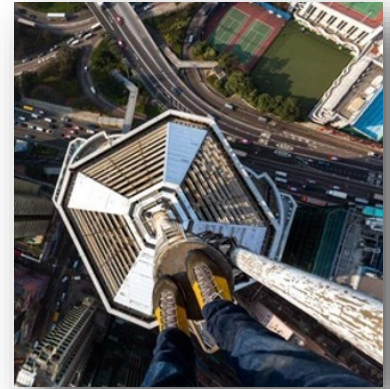
Courses can be delivered at our centre in Buckinghamshire or on site.

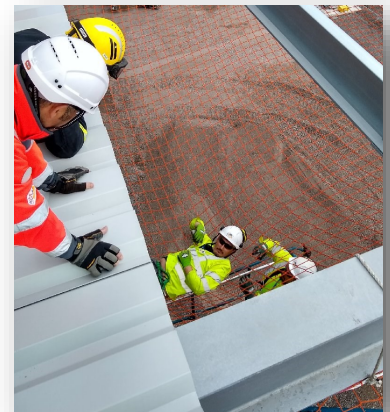
